November 5th: The Final's Show! All riders competing in at least one previous show will qualify to compete in a special Hunter or Jumper classic class with some over the top ribbons and awards! The USHJA Outreach Program has been established to provide the opportunity to participate in USHJA branded classes and competitions, to earn points toward year-end rewards and awards, and to earn the chance to participate in the prestigious USHJA National Championships. The USHJA Outreach Program offers show managers a way to provide safe, fair and sportsmanlike competition. Show personnel standards are high and require membership in USHJA and Safe Sport Training. This includes show manager, adjudicator, course designer and judges.

Points will be accumulated according to Zone, within the competition year dating December 1st to November 30th of the following year.

*Riders must be an Outreach member or higher on or before the first day of competition to accrue rider points. Membership is free. At least three entries must complete the class for points to count.

*Horses must be registered with USHJA for points to be tracked. Otherwise, horses are not required to be registered with USHJA or be microchipped to compete in USHJA Outreach classes. Horse Registration is \$20 for an Annual Recording and \$75 for a Lifetime Recording. At least three entries must complete the class for points to count.

1st Place-10 points

2nd Place-6 points

3rd Place-4 points

4th Place-2 points

5th Place-1 point

6th place-1/2 point

*Trainers of riders participating in the USHJA Outreach Program wishing to to be recognized for year-end awards must be a USHJA Outreach member or higher on or before the first day of competition. Outreach membership is free.

Rewards and Awards will be given by USHJA Zone and are based on rider or horse participation across any USHJA Outreach class. A rider or horse may accumulate points throughout any or all of the different types of classes, allowing for participation across the many facets of the hunter, jumper and equitation competitions.

Handy Hunter classes simulate those found in trappy hunting country. The course must have at least two changes of direction and at least two of the following: hand gallop a jump, bending line, rollback turn, fence at the end of the ring, or open a gate while mounted or trot over one obstacle. Judges must place emphasis on promptness and tight turns with precedence being given in that order. Handiness is defined as time and ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Hand Gallop is defined as a significant increase in pace without sacrificing performance or style.

Open classes have no restrictions

Horse/Rider combinations in all Junior and Amateur classes may not cross enter into any class that is more than 3" lower at the same show.

Jumper classes have no restrictions. Time will be kept manually

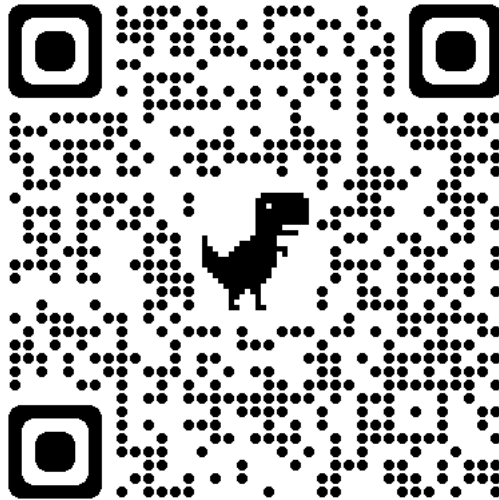

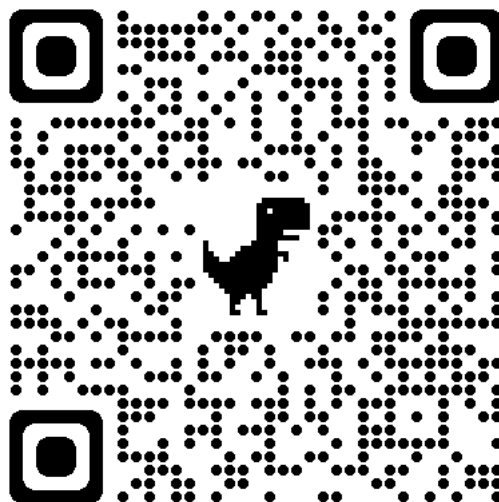

Basic Specifications and Rules: see USEF rule book at www.USEF.org for more detailed information:

Juniors: riders who have not reached their 18th birthday by December 1st of the competition year

Amateur: adult riders who do not receive remuneration for teaching and/or training

Protective Headgear is required at all times while mounted on a horse or pony

Hunters:

To be judged on performance, soundness, suitability and manners. Conformation considered in the Model and Breeding classes only. Jumps will simulate fences that could be found in the field; gates, walls, post and rails etc. Courses will have a minimum of 6 jumps. There will not be any oxers in courses 2'3" and lower. Combinations may only be used for courses 3' or higher. Snaffles, pelhams and full bridles, all with cavesson nose bands are required. Judges may penalize for unconventional bits which include hunter gags, kimberwicks etc. and must eliminate for illegal bits and nosebands which include three rings, gags, etc. and drop, flash and figure eight nosebands. All artificial appliances, including but not limited to nasal strips, boots, wraps, and bandages are prohibited. In the case of inclement weather competition management may permit the use of bell boots. Standing or running martingales are allowed in over fences classes. Martingales are not allowed in under saddle classes. Elimination occurs for going off course, fall of horse and/or rider, the third refusal and loss of control of horse. Conventional attire encouraged and preferred.

Equitation: See USEF rulebook for detailed position and class descriptions. Conventional attire encouraged and preferred.

To be judged on the riders position and ability to control and communicate with their horse. Judges, at their discretion, may call on tests of the riders from the USEF Equitation tests:

X-rails-18" : Tests 1 & 3

2'-2'3" Tests 1,3,5,7,11

2'6" and up Tests 1-17

Boots and wraps are permitted. Standing and running martingales are permitted over fences. Martingales are not permitted on the flat. Conventional and legal bits are permitted. Elimination for going off course, fall of horse and/or rider, the third refusal, and loss of control of horse.

Jumper: See USEF rulebook for more detailed rules. Standard jumper attire.

Jumpers must wait for an audible signal from the judge before commencing their course. Time starts when the horse's chest crosses the start line and stops when the horse's chest crosses the finish line.

Jumpers are judged on faults and time. Knockdowns and refusals earn 4 faults. Exceeding the time allowed earns 1 fault for each commenced second. Elimination occurs for a horse resisting for more than 45 consecutive seconds, taking more than 45 seconds to jump the first obstacle, taking more than 45 seconds to jump the next obstacle, fall of horse and/or rider, jumping an obstacle before it is reset, starting before judge's signal to proceed, jumping an obstacle before crossing the start line or after crossing the finish line, off course, second refusal.

To be judged under the following tables:

Table II.1 Time First Round– the first round is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. Horses with clear rounds or equal faults are classified according to their time taken to complete the course.

Table II 2b The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time allowed. If a competitor has gone clear in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course.

Table II 2c Two Phase Competition– the first phase to consist of 6-8 jumping efforts and the second phase of 4-6 jumping efforts. Scores are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clear in the first phase, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the second phase course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line of the first phase. If there are no clear rounds, faults will determine placing. Equal faults will be tied.

USEF Hunt Seat Equitation Tests

EQ113 Tests from which judges must choose

Tests may be performed either collectively or individually but no other tests may be used. Instructions must be publicly announced. A judge may ask exhibitors to re-jump an abbreviated or shortened form of the original course.

NOTE: In Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation classes, any exhibitor who does not participate in the testing is placed last of those competitors called back to test. Should more than one exhibitor fail to return for testing they will be placed at the judge's discretion. If exhibitors are called back collectively to test, they must remain in the ring until all exhibitors have completed the test. Equitation tests must not have exhibitors trotting or cantering through in gate or out gate; any exhibitor choosing to trot or canter through the in-gate or out-gate must be eliminated. Obstacles jumped in an equitation test must have been included in the original course. Jumps must be jumped in the original direction unless otherwise specified.

1. Halt (4-6 seconds) or halt and back and then continue forward at the walk.
2. Hand Gallop. A hand gallop may be used on the approach to a jump
3. Figure eight at the trot, demonstrating change of diagonals. At left diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when left front leg is on the ground; at right diagonal, rider should be sitting the saddle when right front leg is on the ground; when circling clockwise at a trot, rider should be on left diagonal; when circling counterclockwise, rider should be on the right diagonal.
4. Figure eight at canter on correct lead, demonstrating simple change of lead. This is a change whereby the horse is brought back into a walk or trot (either is acceptable unless the judge specifies) and restarted into a canter on the opposite lead. Figures to be commenced in center of two circles so that one change of lead is shown.
5. Work collectively or individually at a walk, trot, and/or canter.
6. Jump low obstacles at a trot, as well as at a canter. The maximum height for a trot jump is six inches lower than class requirements. Oxers may only be used as a trot jump in classes listed at 3'6" or higher. The maximum spread for a trot fence is 3'.
7. Question(s) regarding basic horsemanship, tack and equipment and conformation.
8. Ride without stirrups, riders must be allowed option to cross stirrups.
9. Turn on the forehand done from the halt.
10. Figure eight at canter on the correct lead demonstrating flying change of lead.
11. Execute serpentine at a trot and/or canter on correct lead demonstrating simple or flying changes of lead
12. Change of leads on a line demonstrating a simple or flying change of lead.
13. Change horses. (Note: this test is the equivalent of two tests.) Obstacles jumped in this equitation test must have been included in the original course or test.
14. Canter on counter lead. (Note: no more than twelve horses may counter canter at one time.) A canter on the counter lead may be used on the approach to a jump.
15. Turn on the haunches from the walk.
16. Demonstration ride of approximately one minute. Rider must advise judge beforehand what ride he plans to demonstrate.
17. Perform basic dressage movements at the collected trot. Judge may choose from: shoulder in, shoulder out, haunches in (travers), haunches out (renvers), leg yield, or half pass.
